December Stop the BleedWorkshop

On December 17 Hermon Mountain Ski Patrol Director Robert Bakker offered a workshop on the national Stop the Bleed Program, designed to prepare individuals to take action in cases of severe bleeding. Robb began the program with a film documenting quick action taken to save a young Vermont slalom racer whose leg was

injured when he fell against his sharpened ski edge. Robb went on to demontrate three techniques that would help save the life of a bleeding victim: using hands to apply pressure to a wound; packing a wound to control bleeding; and applying a tourniquet. Robb is willing to hold similar sessions for others interested in this life-saving technique.





On Again: The Great Caribou Bog Ski Race

Plans to revive PVSC's Great Caribou Bog Ski Race were postponed earlier this month due to weather conditions, but are now back on track. The Club launched the race back in 1984, and at its peak over a hundred racers of all ages participated each year skiing a tract that ran through the Caribou Bog. Due to key organizers moving out of the area, the event was no longer held after 2011. This year's race was originally scheduled for February 8, and has been rescheduled for Saturday, February 29. 




Learn to Ski and Board: Another Busy Season




Chip Cochrane Invitational, Hermon Mountain

On February 9 PVSC hosted the annual Chip Cochran Invitational Alpine Race at Hermon Mountain, an event that hosted around 109 participants, including our own PVSC racers, Greenville's Red Eagles; the Valley Racing Team from Fort Kent, and the Mars Hill BigRock racers. This was the largest Alpine racing event the Club has ever hosted. This gave PVSC an opportunity to showcase its newly rennovated Slim Melvin Timing Hut and our new B-Net safety system.

We had a wonderful day for a race, although cold to start, and we completed the two runs of slalom and two of GS in time to get racers and their families back home at a reasonable hour. The course was designed to add excitement to the race and challenge racers to transition from the tighter slalom gates to GS and back to slalom. More than 120 racers attended from as far away as Fort Kent.
